


# Amigurumi

## Sleepy Doll




What do you need:

- Instructions
- Crochet Hook
- Yarn 2 different colors
- Black yarn
- Stuffing
- Yarn Needle
- Stitch pin




Abbreviations:

CH = Chain Stitch




INC = Increase Stitch



SC = Single Crochet

DEC = Decrease Stitch




HDC = Half Double Crochet


DC = Double Crochet



TR = Triple Crochet




SS = Slip Stitch




BLO = Through Back Loops only


Use a **Stitch Pin** to mark the last stitch of each row, as rows can bleed into each other

## The Body

Create a Magic Ring to start:

Row 1: 6 SC within the ring, pull tight and close with a SC

Use the Stitch pin on every last SC to count the rows

Row 2: 6 INC – total 12 stitches, close row with 1 SC

Row 3: 1 SC + 1 INC – total 18 stitches, close row with 1 SC

Row 4: 2 SC + 1 INC – total 24 stitches, close row with 1 SC

Row 5: 3 SC + 1 INC – total 30 stitches, close row with 1 SC

Row 6: 4 SC + 1 INC – total 36 stitches, close row with 1 SC

Row 7: 5 SC + 1 INC – total 42 stitches, close row with 1 SC

Row 8: 6 SC + 1 INC – total 48 stitches, close row with 1 SC

Row 9-14: 1 SC all around – total 48 stitches, close row with 1 SC

Row 15: 6 SC + 1 Decrease – total 42 stitches, close row with 1 SC

Row 16-19: 1 SC all around – total 42 stitches, close row with 1 SC

Row 20: 5 SC + 1 Decrease – total 36 stitches, close row with 1 SC

Row 21-24: 1 SC all around – total 36 stitches, close row with 1 SC

Row 25: 4 SC + 1 Decrease – total 30 stitches, close row with 1 SC


Row 26-29: 1 SC all around – total 30 stitches, close row with 1 SC

Row 30: 3 SC + 1 Decrease – total 24 stitches, close row with 1 SC

Row 31-36: 1 SC all around – total 24 stitches, close row with 1 SC

Start Stuffing the body, the last row is 36



## The Head

Create a Magic Ring to start:


- Row 1: 6 SC within the ring, pull tight and close with a SC
- Row 2: 6 INC – total 12 stitches, close row with 1 SC
- Row 3: 1 SC and 1 INC – total 18 stitches, close row with 1 SC
- Row 4: 2 SC and 1 INC – total 24 stitches, close row with 1 SC
- Row 5: 3 SC crochet and 1 INC – total 30 stitches, close row with 1 SC
- Row 6: 4 SC and 1 INC – total 36 stitches, close row with 1 SC
- Row 7: 5 SC and 1 INC Stitch – total 42 stitches, close row with 1 SC
- Row 8: 6 SC and 1 INC Stitch – total 48 stitches, close row with 1 SC
- Row 9-15: 1 SC all around – total 48 stitches, close row with 1 SC
- Row 16: 6 SC and 1 DEC – total 42 stitches, close row with 1 SC
- Row 17: 5 SC and 1 DEC – total 36 stitches, close row with 1 SC
- Row 18: 4 SC and 1 DEC – total 30 stitches, close row with 1 SC
- Row 19: 3 SC and 1 DEC – total 24 stitches, close row with 1 SC
- Row 20: 2 SC and 1 DEC – total 18 stitches, close row with 1 SC
- Row 21: 1 SC and 1 DEC – total 12 stitches, close row with 1 SC

Start stuffing the head, row 22 will close the opening

- Row 22: 6 Decrease Stitches and finish it to close it

**Hope you have a nice round ball as a head**




# The Hat

Create a Magic Ring to start:

- Row 1: 6 SC within the ring, pull tight and close with a SC
- Row 2: 6 SC all around – total 6 stitches for the row, close row with 1 SC
- Row 3: 1 SC and 1 INC – total 9 stitches, close row with 1 SC
- Row 4-5: 1 SC all around – total 9 stitches, close row with 1 SC
- Row 6: 2 SC and 1 INC – total 12 stitches, close row with 1 SC
- Row 7-8: 1 SC all around – total 12 stitches, close row with 1 SC
- Row 9: 3 SC and 1 INC – total 15 stitches, close row with 1 SC
- Row 10: 1 SC all around – total 15 stitches, close row with 1 SC
- Row 11: 4 SC and 1 INC – total 18 stitches, close row with 1 SC
- Row 12: 1 SC all around – total 18 stitches, close row with 1 SC
- Row 13: 5 SC and 1 INC – total 21 stitches, close row with 1 SC
- Row 14: 1 SC all around – total 21 stitches, close row with 1 SC
- Row 15: 6 SC and 1 INC – total 24 stitches, close row with 1 SC
- Row 16: 7 SC and 1 INC – total 27 stitches, close row with 1 SC
- Row 17: 1 SC all around – total 27 stitches, close row with 1 SC
- Row 18: 8 SC and 1 INC – total 30 stitches, close row with 1 SC
- Row 19: 4 SC and 1 INC – total 36 stitches, close row with 1 SC
- Row 20: 5 SC and 1 INC – total 42 stitches, close row with 1 SC
- Row 21: 6 SC and 1 INC – total 48 stitches, close row with 1 SC
- Row 22-27: 1 SC all around – total 48 stitches, close row with 1 SC

**Close off at that row and stuff the hat lightly.**



## The Arms


Make 2 of these

Create a Magic Ring to start:

- Row 1: 6 SC within the ring, pull tight and close with a SC
- Row 2: 6 INC – total 12 stitches, close row with 1 SC
- Row 3: 1 SC and 1 INC – total 18 stitches, close row with 1 SC
- Row 4: 1 SC all the way around – total 18 stitches, close row with 1 SC
- Row 5: 1 SC all the way around – total 18 stitches, close row with 1 SC
- Row 6: 1 SC and 1 DEC – total 12 stitches, close row with 1 SC
  
- Row 7: **Here is where we change color to mark the hands**  
1 SC all around – total 12 stitches, close row with 1 SC
- Row 8 -17 1 SC all around – total 12 stitches, close row with 1 SC

**17 is the last row, close the loop and stuff the arm**
